Take the above worship song as a prayer too, listening and reflecting on the desire to see the Kingdom come, with signs and miracles, lives changed and chains & powers of darkness broken as God moves. Imagine the five people you are praying for, being held out to God, for Him to meet with them.

Then,

Think of some other groups of people. Jesus didn't build his Kingdom in a building during his lifetime, though he tried to bring his message to the Jewish centres of worship. We have our church buildings and meeting places and centres where we worship. We are an “Ekklesia”, which is a gathering, so Jesus' plan was for us to meet and fellowship together. The Pandemic has affected whether people came to worship as a physical Body and has had many other effects too. We haven't all returned to be one together yet, Edge has had to run Edge Lite. We seem to have lost some connection with people we were used to sharing with and we miss them.

Pray for all those who are/were part of Church & Edge and have lost their engagement or have returned but lost heart as a result of circumstances. Pray for a returning, a renewing and a reviving amongst the people of God. Keep blessing them and re-calling them in prayer. Pray for those who may have drifted away, and may be vulnerable for re assurance of God's love for them and his call on their lives.

Pray for all those who have had some connection with our Christian community in Selby during the Pandemic or have shared in worship online, or via social media. Those who may have had connection with the Church nationally through foodbanks, debt help, church based schemes and all those who may have become interested in faith through tasting something of the care and love of God in difficult times. Help us to lead them to Jesus. Pray for those who suffered as a result of Covid or became bereaved and isolated during the Pandemic, pray that they may be asking questions about life and death and find the answer in Jesus.
